Simmo's Tyre Tips – Potholes and the damage they can do...

With the condition of our roads at the moment you need to be extra vigilant as to what you drive over, through, or round. Some of the potholes on the roads have potential seriously damage the wheels, tyres and suspension on your vehicle. We have seen over the winter months dozens of damaged wheels and tyres due to this - which costs a lot of money to put right. Wheels have cracks and large dents engineer requiring an straighten them; wheel alignments need doing too as suspension components can bent or put out of specification if hit hard enough. A lot of this damage gets picked up at WOF time which causes delays and inconvenience. So when you're out there driving stay alert and try not to drive over potholes if you can help it. Baileys Chocolate Cheesecake

When Anita was a teenager, her mum, Alison, used to make the most delish no bake Baileys Chocolate cheesecake for a special dessert. It was a typical 70's dessert and she hasn't been able to find the same recipe again, but this one is pretty darn close. Super easy and all you need to do make it gluten free is swap out the digestive biscuits for a GF option.

Ingredients

100g butter

250g digestive biscuits, crushed (I use chocolate wheaten)

100g plain chocolate

50ml cream

150g white chocolate

100ml Baileys © or other cream liqueur 250g Philadelphia cream cheese

Method

(Prep 20 minutes. Extra time 3 hours, setting)

- 1. Gently melt the butter in a saucepan. Add the crushed biscuits and mix until the butter has been fully absorbed. Press the mixture in the bottom of a springform tin and leave in the fridge to set.
- 2. In the meantime, melt the plain chocolate in a bowl placed on top of a saucepan with hot water. Make sure there is a gap between the bowl and the hot water and the water is not boiling as too hot a temperature would spoil the chocolate.
- 3. Once the chocolate is melted, add the cream, mix well and leave on the side. Melt the white chocolate using the same technique. Mix the dark chocolate with the white one, slowly adding Baileys ©.
- 4. In a separate bowl, whisk the cream cheese, add the chocolate mixture and beat for a couple of minutes until smooth and fluffy.
- 5. Place the mixture on the top of the biscuit base and leave in the fridge to set for at least 3 hours. I tend to leave it overnight.
- 6. Decorate as desired either whipped cream, chocolate shavings or even chocolate sauce and berries!
